Brand: Generals / extra hard, hard, medium, soft, extra soft

White Charcoal or charcoal pencil or white pastel pencil

Pastel pencil: shades: sanguine or or burnt sienna-type colors

India ink

Brand: Higgins or Winsor & Newton Shades: Black and Sepia (optional)

Pen nibs (optional) or black felt tip pen, (fine point) in black and sepia colors

Watercolor or nylon blend brush

2 - 3 Sizes, such as #2, #4 & #6, Shapes: round
