Materials for Painting the Portrait in Oils with Toby Hall

Decent materials will make your life easier and the process more enjoyable, but I am quite flexible when it comes to what you choose to use as far as paints, brushes and supports go. Paint

- Artists' grade
- Gamblin, Holbein, Rembrandt, Old Holland, etc.
- I'm open to most palettes, limited, extensive, or somewhere in the middle
- *at a minimum, I will be using: titanium white, yellow ochre, transparent red earth/ translucent red oxide, cadmium red (medium), ultramarine blue & ivory black (again, if you want to experiment with a different palette of colors - extended chromatic, or even more limited, that's totally fine with me)
- Depending on the setup, I might add additional colors to the palette.

Brushes

- Rounds (filberts are fine too)
- Synthetic, bristle, etc.
- Variety of sizes depending on support scale
- *I recommend 2-3 of each size you choose to bring)

Support

- For the main project, I recommend stretched or mounted linen/or gessoed panel
- 9"x 12" or a little bigger/smaller depending on your preference There are decent options for sale at Artisan
- Arches Oil Paper will be great for smaller exercises/poster studies
- I recommend priming it with a couple coats of matte medium but also, feel free to use:
- Stretched primed linen or even linen scraps, primed linen panel, acrylic gesso panel
